




## 'The Toast Rack'

A new venture called 'the Toast Rack', is being organised by Sandy Rowles at St Michael's. We hope that this will be an opportunity for people to meet and chat, and perhaps for some to get used to being out and about again in a safe and friendly forum. No charge will be made, but any donations are always welcome.

## From Richard Hubbard, Cantus Firmus Trust.

We had been planning a World Praise Weekend at St Edmundsbury Cathedral, which was to include a performance of the cantata Zimbe, for children's choir, adult choirs and jazz ensemble. However, recent Covid restrictions have meant that most of the schools who were signed up to take part are not allowed to hold rehearsals, so we have had to postpone this.



Instead we have relaunched the event as a **World Praise Day on Saturday 26 February**, with a **workshop from 1.30 – 3.30pm** led by Geoff Weaver, and a **World Praise Service at 4.30pm** led by the Bishop of Dunwich. The service will comprise congregational songs from around the world, which we will learn in Geoff Weaver's workshop, together with some items sung by Cantus Firmus Choir..
